SAHAKARINI CELEBRATES 40 YEARS

Sahakarini at 40 years of age is a mature lady still going about the business of living up to her name of “working together” with her overseas project partners and her local partners here at home. Forty years of making a difference in the lives of people! Building Sand Dams in Kenya, supporting a health clinic in Nepal, a Children’s college in India, vegetable gardens and food supply in Colombia are a sample of the good work that changes and has changed people’s lives.

For us here at home, it gives joy to know that we can make a difference. That joy and sense of accomplishment enriches our lives and encourages participants to give of time and talent to local homegrown projects and programs right where we are planted.

The future is before us. How will this Grand Dame Sahakarini look and work in the days and years ahead? Come and join us as we celebrate the past 40 years and begin to unpack the future.

CURRENT PROJECTS IN AFRICA, INDIA AND NEPAL

We are currently supporting two, with the possible addition of a third, sanitation and health related projects serving the needs of women and families in impoverished rural areas of Africa, India and Nepal.

Nyuvat Project SHINE (Ngorongoro Conservation Area, Tanzania) involves local soap production and distribution as well as sanitation health education in rural communities. Entrepreneurship training for soap sales to local hotels and lodges provides the possibility of additional income to support soap making training and basic soap making ingredient purchases. Biosand filter (\$70 US per unit cost) availability and training in installation and maintenance greatly enhance the quality of water available for family use. These filters remove 90% of bacterial and 100% of parasitic contamination and can remain functional for a decade.

Friends of Shanta Bhawan Primary Health Center (Kathmandu, Nepal) is functioning well and serving the need for health care for local families of limited means. The clinic has recently moved to a cleaner and more spacious location and is actively promoting its available services to the local community. An added outpatient pediatric care component supports the clinic’s focus on providing family centered health care at minimal patient cost. Clients are quickly recognizing and supporting the

quality of locally accessible quality medical care available to them.

An upcoming joint project possibility, with Shanti Life India Foundation is centred in Gujarat state, India. It is focused on empowering vulnerable village women to achieve safe and healthy living conditions in rural areas as well as an opportunity to attain a source of livelihood for their families and themselves. Those chosen will be provided with entrepreneurship training and access to low interest micro- loans which are locally recycled as they are repaid. Projects being locally evaluated and supported will deal with water management and hygiene related services which are much needed in their communities.

It is both exciting and gratifying to see how funding such local initiatives is resulting in not only improving the quality of life for people but also allowing them the opportunity to manage and sustain the projects through their own efforts. Such empowerment truly gives them hope for a better future.
